The program not only entertained and educated many who attended the Indian Dance School event for the first time but also showed the creative potential of Gauri Jog

who has been practicing Kathak for the past 35 years.

In order to raise awareness of Indian culture in the US and promote education through the arts, Gauri Jog formed Indian Dance School 15 years ago and has now developed it as a reputable non-profit dance institute in Chicago area offering classes in Indian Classical dance, Bollywood and Yoga.

The group has staged more than 230 shows since 1999 including much-admired dance dramas such as Kathak Yatra, Shakuntala, Queen of Jhansi, Fire the Fiery tale, East meets West, Ramayana among others.

"From dancing at countless multicultural shows to performing in Daley Plaza downtown for the mayor of Chicago, to presenting a piece at the 2016 Chicago Olympic Bid, the group was challenged and introduced to a wide variety of exciting venues to perform every year", a senior student of Gauri Jog said.
